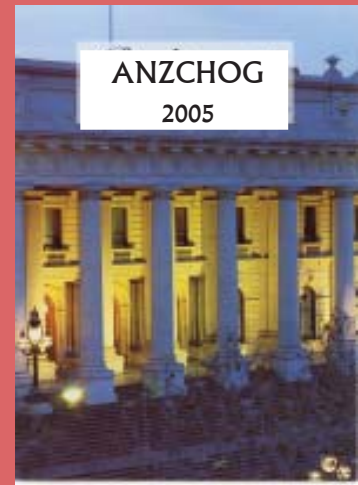

We will have the opportunity to consult with Professor Irwin Epstein, Hunter College, New York, who will join us for the morning. Professor Epstein has taught applied research courses and conducted practice-based research workshops at universities and psychosocial care agencies in the United States, Australia, Europe and Israel. Professor Epstein is extensively published. His most recent book, co-edited with Dr Susan Blumenfeld, is entitled "Clinical Data-Mining in Practice-Based Research: Social Work in Hospital Setting". Professor Epstein is a strong proponent of the view that research on clinical issues should be conducted by the "experts" – the practitioners!

After a productive morning, the afternoon will be devoted to discussion of practice issues. The day will finish with a business meeting.

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

Oral or poster presentations are encouraged on any aspect related to paediatric oncology.

All abstracts will be reviewed by the organising committee. Preference will be given to proposals that are designed to provide information that can be used or implemented by the attendees.

The purpose of the abstract is to give delegates a narrative overview of your presentation. Accepted paper and poster abstracts will be published in the meeting handbook. Oral presentations in the main program will be 10 minutes with 5 minutes question time.

Please note that one author must be a member of ANZCHOG.

Instructions for Submission

1. Please use Arial font; 10 - point type
2. List the author(s)' name(s), institution(s), city and state underneath the abstract title.
3. The abstract text should be typed single-spaced.
4. Please do not exceed 300 words for abstracts
5. Abstracts must be submitted in Microsoft Word via email to anzchog2005@sapmea.asn.au no later than **Thursday 24 March 2005**.
6. Email submissions must include full name and contact details of presenting author.
7. Please include a short biography of the presenting author (no more than 50 words)
8. Projection facilities will be available for IBM PC Powerpoint slides, and also 35mm transparencies.
9. Please indicate whether your presentation is to be an oral presentation or a poster. If oral presentation, please indicate in which part of the meeting you would prefer to present your paper (nursing, social work, main program, etc).
10. Posters are to be no greater than 1 metre x 1 metre in size and will be presented on velcro receptive boards. Presenters are required to provide own velcro.

Avoidance of Commercialism

All presentations must avoid commercialism. Presentations that constitute promotion and advertising will not be accepted. This specifically includes the pervasive or inappropriate use of logos.

Presentations that are only descriptions of commercial programs or products will not be accepted. If the cost of any presentation has been underwritten to any extent, a clear acknowledgment stating that support and identifying the source should be included.

NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA

At the top of St Kilda Road is the NGV International on St Kilda Road and across the Yarra River is the Ian Potter Centre: NGV Australia at Federation Square. Spanning four levels, the NGV International, St Kilda Road houses Victoria's extensive international collection, one of the most impressive collections in the Southern Hemisphere. The Ian Potter Centre: NGV Australia at Federation Square holds a superb collection of Australian indigenous and non-indigenous art. Spanning from the colonial period to the present day, the collection totals more than 20,000 works.

FEDERATION SQUARE

Federation Square is the striking new city square for Melbourne in the very heart of the city. The size of an entire city block, the Square brings together a creative mix of attractions including leading-edge galleries, cinemas, award-winning restaurants, cafes and bars, events and festivals and grand public open spaces embraced by some of the most unique and striking architecture in the world.

MELBOURNE AQUARIUM

Cnr Queenswharf Road and King St Melbourne

The Melbourne Aquarium, a journey into the Southern Ocean, is a 'must-see' attraction for any visitor to Melbourne. You will enter your journey at 'sink or swim', where you'll discover the delicate leafy sea-dragons, cuttlefish, moray eels and the giant crab. Have a look under the surface of Victoria's bays, estuaries and rivers in the habitats area. You'll see Stingrays and Port Jackson Sharks in the Mangroves, Shark Eggs and Starfish in the Rock Pools, Eels and Turtles in the Billabong and the Port Phillip Bay Exhibit. You will be dazzled with the brilliance of the floor to ceiling coral atoll and mesmerized by the exotic array of neon sea jellies. As you travel deeper you'll travel through transparent tunnels surrounded by fish and a 2.2 million litre oceanarium. In the Fish Bowl, sharks will circle around you. You can talk with the divers as they are feeding and swimming with the Grey Nurse and Seven Gill Sharks, Stingrays and Sea turtles. Finally you'll tackle the high-energy 'Icerun Ride' - the ultimate underwater experience. Visitors should allow approximately 2 hours for their tour of the Melbourne Aquarium.

MELBOURNE MUSEUM

The modernist Melbourne Museum is the largest museum complex in the southern hemisphere. Spread over six huge levels, half of which are below ground level, the museum draws on the latest technology to give an insight into Australia's flora, fauna and culture. Highlights include the Science and Life Gallery and the Australia Gallery, focusing on the vibrant history of Melbourne and Victoria – from Australia's iconic racehorse Phar Lap to the kitchen set from the *Neighbours* TV show. The museum is located in the Carlton Gardens, 11 Nicholson Street, Carlton.

The Rialto Towers Building is one of the most recognised icons in Melbourne, making it an essential experience for visitors to the city. The Melbourne Observation Deck, located on level 55 of the Rialto Towers Building, provides an optimum viewing platform inside the tallest office building in the Southern Hemisphere.
